- Calm down :- Stop being angry शांत होना

 - Call off:- cancel रद्द करना
 Our Principal called off the meeting.
 - Care for:- Like पसंद
 I don't care for fizzy drinks, I prefer water.
 - > Carry on :- continue जारी रखो
 Carry on quietly with your work.
 - Give up:- stop doing something छोड़ देना
 I give up taking sugar in tea and coffee.
- Blow out:- extinguish
 He blew out all candles on his birthday.
- Act on :- To take action on something. किसी चीज़ पर काम करना The police acted on a tip from an informer and caught the thief.

Phrasal verbs with 'call'

1. CALL AFTER

- a) To give a child the same name as someone else, especially someone from the same family.
- e.g. The baby was **called after** her grandmother.

2. CALL AT

- a) To stop at a place for a brief period of time (usually referring to a ship or train)
- e.g. The ship will **call at** several ports on the way to the Bahamas.

3. CALL AWAY

- a) To ask someone to leave somewhere or stop what they're doing in order to go somewhere else, usually urgently.
- e.g. She was **called away** from the meeting to take an urgent phone call.

4. CALL BACK

- a) To return a telephone call
- e.g. I am driving. Can I call you back later?

5. CALL BY

- a) To visit someone briefly on your way to somewhere else
- e.g. Let's **call by** Alice's place on our way back from town.

6. CALL DOWN

- a) To telephone or shout to someone downstairs
- e.g. **Call down** to reception and ask for some more cups for the meeting.
- **b)** To pray for something bad to happen
- e.g. I shall call down God's wrath upon you!

7. CALL FOR

- a) To publicly demand or ask for an action to happen
- e.g. After the fire, the residents **called for** better health and safety procedures.
- **b)** Something that is required or necessary
- e.g. The job calls for excellent communication and networking skills.
- c) To deserve a particular action
- e.g. This good news calls for champagne!

8. CALL OFF

- a) To cancel a plan or event that is happening or will happen
- e.g. The Match was called off due to rain.

9. CALL OUT

- a) To shout or speak loudly in order to get someone's attention
- e.g. I called out her name, but she couldn't hear me over the music.
- b) To ask someone to come and carry out a job/do something
- e.g. We had to **call out** the plumber when there was no water in our house.

- 10. CALL UP
 - a) To telephone someone
 - e.g. I called up Tom yesterday as we hadn't spoken in months.
 - **b)** To bring back memories
 - e.g. That music **calls up** summers in the Lake District.
 - **c)** To open something on the computer, bring up (Brit. Eng.)
 - e.g. If you want to **call up** the document, we can go through it together.

Commonly used Idioms & Phrases

- 1. Pick the brain: To seek advice from a person who knows a lot e.g. I have some doubts I need to pick your brain.
- **2. Cut to the chase**: Come to the point e.g. I don't have much time, cut to the chase.
- 3. Cup of tea: Not interested in e.g. Flattery is not my cup of tea.
- **4. 24x7**: Non-stop always e.g. The pharmacy is open 24/7(24 Hours a day,7 days a week).
- **5. Your call**: To leave a decision on another person e.g. It's your call whether you want to go or not.
- **To be taken by someone**: To be attracted by a particular plan or person e.g. I was taken in by his words.
- 7. (to feel) Under the weather: to feel sick, low in energye.g. I am feeling under the weather today. So I can't come to your house.
- 8. Dark horse: Someone who has a surprising ability or skill e.g. He turned out to be a dark horse.

- **2. Red handed-** Caught while committing a crime e.g. He was caught **red handed** by the police.
- **3.** Red carpet welcomee.g. The actor was given a red-carpet welcome.

- In the red- Losse.g. Due to negligence the company was in the red.
- Grey Area- Something without a clear rule or answer
 e.g. Writing personal Email in the office is a grey area that needs to be discussed at the next meeting.
- 7. **Green Thumb** To be skilled at the garden e.g. My mother has a **green thumb**. She can make anything grow.
